



Getting Ready for First Grade Summer Learning

Dear First Grade Parents:

Attached is the learning menu for your child to work on over the summer. Many of the assignments can be completed independently and others may require some adult support and help. I've included a handwriting guide for reference as your child writes. Primary lined paper can be purchased or printed from an online resource, but please do use primary lined paper to encourage proper size and formation of letters. A primary lined journal is on the supply list, so if you go ahead and purchase one, your child could use this for homework and continue using it when school starts.

Some of the best things to do to help your child continue to learn, rather than slip back over the summer, are fairly simple things. Reading to and with your child is the single best way to support their continued growth. As you read, stopping to ask questions about what might happen next, who, what, why questions, and even where the story takes place will help them think about and comprehend the text.

Writing during the summer isn't always easy, but can be fun. Maybe your child could write a letter to a relative or friend. Authentic writing experiences are usually the best way to encourage young writers. Spelling things the way they sound phonetically is great at this stage, but spelling words correctly with help is fine too.

Counting and grouping items in a natural setting will keep those math skills sharp. For example, as you put apples in the bag at the grocery, simply count as you go. If you are organizing a cabinet or closet, sort and count the number of each item and ask how many in all. Kids learn so much through all of those little everyday things you do with them.

When we return to school (I know we don't even want to think about that yet!) students will have opportunities to talk and write and draw about summer. The summer field trips, anything from going to a park to play to going on a vacation, or visiting friends or family, are great topics for later. I'm looking forward to hearing great summer stories!
